

Owners and Occupants of 6315 22nd Ave NE

This address is in Parcel 8824900100 of University Place Addition, Block 2, Lot 11, Code 0010, in Plat Book 16 .

Prehistory

Schools. The town of Ravenna was formed in **1906**. A suburban school was started called Ravenna, Dist. 148 in a one room building at the site which is now 22nd Ave NE and NE 63rd St. The teacher was Kate Sterling. In **1907** the teachers were F. J. Waldron and June Oakley. In **1909** the teachers were Jessie McDonald and Edith Mason, and in **1910** they were Verna L. Nichols and Burnie L. Woodruff. In **1911** the new Ravenna School was opened on Ravenna Ave NE between NE 65th St. and NE 68th St.¹

Becoming part of Seattle. The University Place was an addition to the City of Seattle on May 27, **1907**. It is from lots 1 and 2 of Ravenna Springs Park Addition to the City of Seattle. Lot 1 is between Ravenna Ave NE and 22nd Ave NE, E 63rd and E 65th. Lot 2 is between 22nd Ave NE and 21st Ave NE.(total 21 lots). On Aug. 7, **1907**, J D. Sherrick dedicated the streets in University Place to the use of the public forever.²

Between **1900** and **1910** the population of Seattle grew from 80,671 to 237,144, and the school census grew from 14,507 to 43,185.³

The Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition was held in **1909** on what is now the University of Washington campus.

Development. In **1919** "Gardner J. Gwinn has purchased from M. J. Carrigan and James E. White sixty lots in the University Place Addition"⁴ The University Place Addition extends from 20th Ave NE to Ravenna Ave NE and from Naomi Place to NE 65th St. Cost will be \$4,000 to \$7,000 per home. Eighteen houses will be built on 22nd Ave NE. "The Pacific Highway runs through the center of the six city blocks embraced in this purchase." There was only one house on 22nd Ave NE between E 62nd and E 65th St. at the time - 6310.⁵ There is no entry for this address in the 1920 Census. The only entry in the 1920 City Directory is for 6310 22nd Ave NE, John J. McNerney, who worked for an oil company, with Ernestine, John, Margaret, and Francis.

The 20th Ave NE Bridge was completed in **1922**. The 15th Ave NE Bridge (now called the Cowan Park Bridge) was completed in **1936**.

Owners and Occupants

A number of different sources were used to find the owners and occupants. The Seattle City Directories began a reverse directory in **1938**, which enables finding the occupants of 6315 22nd Ave NE. Probably the occupant listed in a particular year was there about January 1st of that year, and someone moving in during the year wouldn't be listed until the next year. The Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections (700 Fifth Ave., 20th floor) has Property Abstracts going back to the **1890s**. They are in a Microfilm library, and give records of sales of the property. The Grantee and Grantor, as well as dates, are given. These were used especially for dates on or before **1937** because they gave the name of the owner, and that name could then be searched for in the City Directory. Some of these names are listed in the National Historic District, Ravenna.pdf (**2018**). The Federal Census in **1920** and **1930** was used to find occupants in those years by locating the election district that included the property, and that gave all the occupants of the property. Of course, the Property Abstracts give an exact date of sale, whereas the City Directory gives the occupant on a particular date in the year. It was found, though, that most of the owners were also the occupants. Thus the name listed for a specific year should be considered approximate for the first year and last year the name is listed, since the City Directory only lists occupants once per year.

1917 On Oct. 23, 1916 M. J. Carrigan sold the property (undeveloped, items 1-12) to Jamie E. White (deceased), McClendon, Administrator.⁶

1919 The Seattle Daily Times reported that "Gardner J. Gwinn has purchased from M. J. Carrigan and James E. White sixty lots in the University Place Addition." The lots extend from 20th Ave NE to Ravenna Ave NE and from Naomi Place to NE 65th St. The cost will be \$4,000 to \$7,000 per home. Eighteen houses will be built on 22nd Ave NE. "The Pacific Highway runs through the center of the six city blocks embraced in this purchase."⁷ On Dec. 9, **1919** Jamie E. White (deceased), McClendon, Admin, sold four properties (items 9, 10, 11, 12) to the University Construction Co. The owner of that company was Gardner J. Gwinn.⁸ Item 11 is 6315 22nd Ave NE. Since construction had not started by that date, no one would be living in the house during 1919.

1920-1923 The 1920 U. S. Census was taken in this area on Jan. 5, 1920. The only house in the 6300 block of 22nd Ave. NE is at 6310. That is the same house (and only house) that is shown on the maps of the area for the same time. On March. 6, 1920 (recorded Mar. 8) University Construction Co. sold the property to Edwin S. Dunbar. The Property Abstracts also say on March 8, 1920 (recorded Mar. 9) the University Construction Co. sold the property to Sioux Securities. Presumably Edwin Dunbar bought part of the house and Sioux Securities were the owners of the rest. The Dunbar is listed in the **1921, 1922, and 1923**

Seattle City Directories as: Dunbar Eugene M. (Lucia W) h6315 22nd Ave NE.⁹ (Did his father buy it?) Since they were the first to buy the property from the construction company, they probably lived there in **1920**, too. On Nov. 24, 1922 Sioux Securities sold the property (11) to E. L. Graves, and on Dec. 20, 1922 a group of four sold it (11 and 12) back to Sioux Securities. E. L. Graves was not listed as living there but he was the bookperson, later assistant secretary of Sioux Securities. The census entries for Edwin L Graves are:

1924 On Apr. 16, **1923** Edwin J. Dunbar and wife sold the property to E. C. Brock. The Brock family is listed as living there in **1924** as Brock Elmer C. (Florence) mgr. Geo PId e & Co. Inc. h6315 22nd Ave NE.

1925-1926 The McHan family is listed as living there: McHan Edgar L. (Etta) worked at a restaurant at 153 Washington, and lived at h6315 22nd Ave NE. I can find no record of the sale from Brock to McHan.

1927 On Feb. 11, **1927** E. L. McHan and wife Etta sold the property to J. A. Van Ostran and wife Carrie L. The City Directory for **1927** lists Van Ostran Jos A (Carrie L) slsmn h6315 22 av NE and McHan, Edgar L (Etta; Edart's Café) h6315 22 av NE. In 1925 the Van Ostrans lived at 744 N. Broadway, while in **1926** they lived at 6233 12th Ave NE.

On Jun. 9, **1933** Joseph A. Van Ostran sold the house to L. L. Heines and wf. Susie S. Joseph Van Ostrans moved to 201 (?) 17th Ave NE.

1934 Heines Lee L. (Susie S) pres.-mgr. Soya Millers Inc. h6315 22nd Ave NE, and Sisie L. (stud.) r6315 22nd Ave NE.

1935 Heines Lee L. (Susie S.) slsmn EPC h6315 22nd Ave NE and Sisie L. Stdt. R6315 22nd Ave NE. On Mar. 14 **1935** L. L. Heines and wf. Susie S. sold the property to Dean S. Newhouse. Prior to that Dean Newhouse (Alice) ass. dean men UofW lived at 4039 9th Ave NE, Apt. B.

1936 Newhouse Dean (Alice) asst. dean men UofW h6315 22nd Ave NE

1937 Newhouse Dean (Alice) registrar UofW h6315 22nd Ave NE. On Aug. 23, **1937** Dean S. Newhouse sold the house to A. M. McQuarrie. On Aug. 24, **1937** it was sold back to Dean S. Newhouse & wife Alice M. and the same day the couple sold it back to A. M. McQuarrie.

1938-1944: McQuarrie Arch M @ (@ means someone there owned the home. (City Directory uses two circles, one inside the other.) The McQuarrie family is described in another document, *Family of Archibald M. McQuarrie*. In **1935** Helen McQuarrie had died.

1945 On Jun. 21, 1945 Archibald and Frieda McQuarrie sold the property to Patrick Mundy and his wife Sally J. Patrick J. Mundy also paid the fee.¹⁰

1945-1947 – No City Directories published. The National Historic District document lists Albrecht being associated with the address in 1943-48. However, Frieda's maiden name was Albrecht. While there were no City Directories for this time period, they list McQuarrie in **1943-44** and Sherman in **1948-49**. On Apr. 11, **1947** Patrick Mundy and wf. Sally J. sold the house to John C. Sherman and wf Helen Jean. While there are no City Directories for the years **1945, 1946, 1947** Patrick Mundy and his wife Sally J. were the presumed occupants since they bought it in **1945** and sold it in **1947**.

1964 The house is listed as being sold Dec. 28, 1964, but the Sherman's are still listed as occupying it in **1965**.¹¹ It was sold to Robert P. LaBouy and Dorothy Jean.

Bruce Finlayson was Asst. Prof., Assoc. Prof., Prof. and Chair of Chemical Engineering. Christine Finlayson went to UW and was in Sigma Kappa sorority.

Connection with Military

2. Son of Elmer and Florence Brock, 1924

James C. Brock, was 2nd LT, Infantry in Seattle Times, June 16, 1935.

6. Newhouse, Dean (Alice) 1936-1937

While not in the military, Dean Newhouse, as Dean of Men, recruited 500 UW men students to collect scrap metal (Oct. 14, 1942, p.12) and 1000 men and women students to go to eastern WA to pick apples. He was also an armed-service representative at UW. After the war he helped to get transportation to and from school for the veterans living in Steward Heights Housing Project. He also lead a Bond Issue Drive (1946). He gave a talk "War Without Hate" (Seattle Times, Feb. 15, 1942).

7. Son of McQuarrie, Archibald M (Helen) 1938-1944

Matthew D. McQuarrie was in Medical Replacement Training at Camp Barkeley, TX and was promoted to technician fifth grade during World War II

9. Son of Sherman John C (Helen) 1948-1964

John H. Sherman enlisted in the Marines Sept. 20, 1966, was an expert rifleman, sent to scout-sniper school, graduated in March, 1967, went to Vietnam and was killed Apr. 19, 1967.

11. Finlayson, Bruce A (Patricia H) 1968-2019

Bruce Finlayson was a LT in the USNR, on active duty from Sept., 1965 to Sept., 1967.

Edwin Sargent Dunbar, birth certificate, 4 July 1921, Chicago, father same name, b. Iowa, 38, mother Ellen Johnson, 28, b. Chicago.

Thus, Edwin Dunbar Jr. would have been born in 1922 when they lived at 6315.

1940 Census: Edwin S. Dunbar, 57, living in Westchester, NY, previously Chicago, born in IL with Ellen J. Dunbar, 46, born IL. Separately, Edwin S. Dunbar Sr(?), 18, b. IL, previously lived in Chicago, father same name, born in Iowa, 38 and mother Ellen Johnson 28 born Chicago.

2. Brock, Elmer C. (Florence) 1924

Seattle Times Daily, Mar. 23, 1959, p. 28: Elmer C. died after a long illness. His wife is still alive. He is buried in Acadia. There son is James C. Brock (only son) and daughter is Virginia.

Seattle Times Daily, Jan. 16, 1974, p. 58: Florence Hanna Brock's funeral was Friday. She is buried in Acadia.

Seattle Times Daily, June 16, 1935, p. 15: James C. Brock was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. Infantry, U.S. Army, from ROTC.

1920 Census: Elmer C. Brock, 32, born in OR, living at 4539 Fifth NE, with Florence Brock, 30, born in Nebraska. He was the manager of a wholesale shirt company. Also living there were Virginia Brock, daughter, 8, born in OR, James Brock, son, 6, born in OR, Lillie Brock, mother, 56, born in OR, Lillian Brock, sister, 20, born in OR.

1930 Census: E. Clay Brock, 43, OR, Florence Brock, 40, born in NE, Virginia Brock, daughter, 18, born in OR, James Brock, son, 16, born in OR. They lived on Belmont Avenue South, monthly rent \$165, he worked as a general agent for Aetna Life Ins.

1940 Census: E. Clay Brock, 52, born in OR, Florence H. Brock, 49, born in Nebraska, living on West Mercer Way. He was a general agent for an insurance company.

Seattle Times Daily, Dec. 18, 1929, p. 8: Edgar L. McHan and Arthur J. Beach operating as Edhart's Catering Co. for Seattle Chamber of Commerce luncheon.

Seattle Times Daily, Feb. 5, 1930, p. 22: they incorporated, \$5000.

Seattle Times Daily, Dean McHan, son: Oct. 6, 1931, p. 20: signed up for freshman crew at UW, just under 6 feet tall; Apr. 22, 1936, p. 16: betrothed to Marcia Rector, he was in Sigma Phi Epsilon; June 30, 1936, p. 20: married Aug. 14, 1936; Aug. 12, 1936, p. 24: marriage license issued. He was 23 and lived at 6245 30th Ave. NE, she, age 21, at 1604 Ravenna Blvd.

Seattle Times Daily, Nov. 15, 1951, p. 33: Edgar L. McHan dies. He was head chef for Von's Café for 25 years. From Death Certificate, the death was on 14 Nov. 1951; his father was William B. Mchan and mother Lora.

Seattle Daily Times, Aug. 29, 1958, p. 27: Mrs. Lee Heines lived in Palm Springs, CA. Her sister, Grace M. Fisher, died Aug. 28, 1958.

1920 Census: Lawrence L. Heines, 31, born in Indiana and Susie, 29, born in Indiana lived in Kansas City with Susie Lee Heines, 6, born in Missouri.

1930 Census: Lee L. Heines, 38, and Susie S. Heines, 37, both born in Indiana, lived in St. Louis. Also Susie Lee Heines, 15, born in Missouri lived there.

1940 Census, Lee, 50, and Susie, 48, lived in Kansas City.

1940 Census: Dean Newhouse, 30, born CO, wife Alice, 32, born ID. Sally Newhouse, 5, ID, and Peter Newhouse, 3, Washington. Lived at 2023 26th North.

Seattle Times Daily, Sept. 19, 1935, p. 15: refers to him as Asst. Dean of Men.

Seattle Times Daily, June 15, 1936, p. 1: he is 26 years old and is named registrar at UW. He did graduate work at Columbia. The next article says he was 27.

Seattle Times Daily, Aug. 16, 1937, p. 19: an ad for lost dog Buster with “Dean Newhouse” on collar. Call East 2373. The house at 6315 22nd Ave NE was sold on Aug. 23, 1937.

Seattle Times Daily, Mar. 17, 1940, p. 20: became Dean of Men. He is 31 years old.

Seattle Times Daily, Feb. 15, 1942, p. 32: Dean Newhouse will give talk “War Without Hate”.

Seattle Times Daily, Oct. 5, 1942, p. 5: meeting about ROTC; Oct. 14, 1942, p. 12: recruited 500 UW men students to collect scrap metal and 1000 to go to eastern WA to pick apples.

Seattle Times Daily, Mar. 19, 1943, p. 12: he was Dean of Men and Armed-Service Representative.

Seattle Times Daily, Feb. 3, 1946, p. 41: He is helping with transportation to and from school and the Steward Heights Housing Project.

Seattle Times Daily, Oct. 23, 1947, p. 9: He is now Director of Student Affairs and gave a talk at a conference in Seattle entitled “Qualities of a Good Management Man.”

City Directory, 1936: Newhouse Dean (Alice) asst. dean men UofW h6315 22nd Ave NE

City Directory, 1937: Newhouse Dean (Alice) registrar UofW h6315 22nd Ave NE.

8. Mundy, Patrick (Sally J) 1945-1947

1930 Census: He was 6, born in Washington, lived in South Ellensburg, Kittitas, WA. His father was James, 37, born in Texas, mother Ida, 34, born in Washington, brother James H., 11, born in Washington.

Patrick James Mundy married Sally Barlow on Dec. 11, 1943 in Kittitas county, WA.

Seattle Times Daily, Apr. 17, 1962, p. 47: Sally Mundy, intent to wed. She was 39 (the daughter).

Patrick J. Mundy died Oct. 23, 1993 in Kittitas.

9. Sherman John C (Helen) 1948-1964

John Clinton Sherman was born in 1916 in Toronto and died Oct. 21, 1996. His wife was Helen, children, Connie Newell, Mary Wood, Barbara Graves, John H. Sherman.

They don't appear in the 1920, 1930, 1940 census, so perhaps they were in Canada at those times.

He was a Geography Professor at UW, advancing from Asst. Prof. to Assoc. Prof. to Professor and then Chair.

Seattle Times Daily, June 2, 1947, p. 5: Mrs. John Sherman gave birth to a boy. They lived at 16254 24th Ave. S.

Seattle Times Daily, July 25, 1962, p. 21: Barbara Jean Sherman, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Sherman attended Seattle U and got a nursing degree. She married Bruce Robert Meier. Apparently the marriage didn't last long because she is referred to as Miss Barbara Sherman in the next article, in 1964.

Seattle Times Daily, Jan. 7, 1964, p. 17: Constance Jean Sherman married Roger Henry Newell, announced this data to Sigma Kappa Sorority sisters.

Seattle Times Daily, Apr. 25, 1967, p. 39: John H. Sherman married Mary Dorsch on Jan. 7, 1967; had enlisted in the Marines Sept. 20, 1966, was an expert rifleman, sent to scout-sniper school and graduated in March. He was killed in combat Apr. 19.

Seattle Times Daily, Apr. 26, 1967, p. 78: John H. Sherman, 21, was killed in action April 19, in Vietnam. His wife is Mary, his parents are Mr. and Mrs. John C. Sherman, and sisters Mrs. Connie Newell, Mary and Barbara Sherman.

City Directory, 1943-44: Sherman John C (Helen J) inst. U of W h8921 5th av NE.

10. La Bouy, Robert P. (Dorothy Jean) 1965-1967

His father was Edward L. La Bouy, born in Rhinprussia, Germany, 25 when Robert was born, and his mother was Marie Ober?Llig (Hubillig in church records), born in Chicago, 24 when Robert was born.

He died between Feb. 4, 1990 and Mar. 4, 1990, in King County.

In 1940 he was 26 and living in Chicago, ward 45, born in Illinois, Single, a nephew of Louis N. Labouy.

Dorothy Jane Cosgrove Labouy died between Feb. 26, 2006 and Mar. 26, 2006. She was born July 24, 1922, and is buried in Seattle. When she died she lived in Bellevue, WA.

In 1964 there is a Robert A LaBow (wife Thelma) and Robt S. but no Robert P & Dorothy in the City Directory.

In the 1966 and 1967 City Directory: Robt. LaBouy is a credit manager for Washington Asphalt. Robt. Jr. is a student living at 6315 22nd av NE. In 1968 Robert Jr. is still listed as

living there: Robt. LaBouy Jr. Revenue OFCR INT REV SERV R6315 22nd NE. This is obviously wrong we took possession of the house in December, 1967.

City Directory, 1966: Shermans are now living at 7424 55th Av NE

1967 City Directory: Robt. LaBouy is a credit manager for Washington Asphalt. Robt. Jr. is a student living at 6315 22nd av NE.

11. Finlayson, Bruce A (Patricia H) 1968-2019

A one-room portable was built near NE Sixty-third Street and Twenty-second Avenue NE in the mid-1890s and named Ravenna. By 1908, there were almost 50 students. Because this property was small and poorly drained, another four-acre tract was purchased at NE Sixty-eighth Street and Twenty-second Avenue NE in 1909. This building was constructed and opened in fall 1911, although city limits didn't encompass it until 1923. (Courtesy Seattle Public Schools.

Over the years they had children: Malcolm A (who married Virginia Ward), Matthew D (who married Naomi G Randall), Ralph A (who married Lillian Straub), Douglas B (who married Ruth P) and Robert Bruce, who married Betty L. They moved frequently and the following lists gives the addresses obtained from the Seattle City Directories, 1919 through 1959.

Archibald Malcolm McQuarrie was born 26 Aug. 1879 in Emerson, Manitoba, Canada. He was married to Helen Barr (1884-1935) on 18 Jun. 1907 in Vancouver, Canada. In 1922 he and his family immigrated from Vancouver, Canada to Seattle. He was naturalized in 1938. Helen died in 1935, and in 1941 he married Frieda Albrecht (1879-). They applied for a wedding license on 25 Aug. 1941, it was issued 29 Aug 1941 on 18 Oct. 1941 they were married at Kitsap, WA. He died 1 Apr. 1959 in Seattle.

Malcolm A. McQuarrie was born 21 Mar. 1908 in Vancouver, Canada. He married Virginia Ward (22 Mar. 1909 – 22 Oct. 1988) on 23 Jun. 1934 in Lewiston, Nez Pierce, ID. He was naturalized in 1938 and died 9 May 1978 in Snohomish.

Matthew D. McQuarrie was born 22 Dec. 1909 and died 8 Jan. 1979 in Bellevue, WA. He was in Medical Replacement Training at Camp Barkeley, TX and was promoted to technician fifth grade during World War II.¹² He was married to Naomi G. as listed in the city directories (which don't give the maiden name) and was a school teacher. Naomi Randall was born 1 Aug 1910 and died 30 Apr. 2004.¹³ G. Naomi McQuarrie is buried in Portland, OR in the Willamette National Cemetery.

It lists her husband as Matthew Bob McQuarrie, married in 1943, and he predeceased her and were married for 35 years. Since Matthew D. McQuarrie died in 1979 and was married to a teacher Naomi, this is the same Naomi. There is another Robert B 'Bob' McQuarrie, born in 1934, who died in Bellingham 14 Jan. 1989, listed in Billion Graves Index, but he is too young to have married Naomi in 1943. Naomi's siblings were Miriam (died before 2004), Ruth (Portland), Frank (Clarkson, WA). Her son Donald and daughter-in-law Laura had three kids.

Ralph A. McQuarrie was born 20 Dec. 1913 in Vancouver, Canada and He married Lillian L. Straub (9 Jan. 1912-1 Oct. 1982) on 24 Jul. 1940 in Kitsap, WA. He served in the Korean War and was wounded in action by a missile and hospitalized on 15 Jun 1952. He died 18 Feb. 1979 in Snohomish.

Douglas B McQuarrie was 12 in 1930 (born Aug. 10, 1918) and is listed as a son in the 1930 census. He graduated from Roosevelt High School on June 16, 1937.¹⁴ Douglas was married to Ruth P, as listed in the 1948-49 City Directory.

Robert Bruce McQuarrie was born 28 Mar. 1926 in Seattle and died 17 Sept. 1995 in Whatcom, WA, Married Betty L., as listed in the 1951, 1952, 1953, 1958 City Directory. Robert B. McQuarrie is buried in Elk, Mendocino, CA according to Family Search.

In the 1930 census Archibald M. Mcquarrie was 47, Helen was 45, Malcolm A was 22, Matthew D was 21, Ralph A was 16, Douglas B. 12, all born in Canada, and Robert B 4 born in Washington.¹⁵

Jacob D. Sherrick

Jacob D. Sherrick was born in Ohio in March, **1851**. His father had been born in Maryland and his mother had been born in Ohio.

On Nov. 30, **1880** he married Julia F. (Vowvie) Sherrick in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. Her father, Antoni Vowvie, and mother, Margaret Miller, had both been born in Germany. Based on information on her death certificate she was born on Jul. 15, **1857**.

In **1900** the family lived in Puyallup, Ward 1,2, Pierce County, Washington. He was a doctor. At that time their children were Florance (sp), aged 19, born in Kansas; Aurthur (sp) D. Sherrick, aged 15, born in Missouri; and Johnson, aged 12, born in Kansas on Sept. 11, 1888. (The 1890 census was lost in a fire, but the King County Census of 1889 (for statehood) does not list him. He is not in the Seattle City Directory of 1890 either.)

In **1900** Mrs. J. D. Sherrick and daughter, Miss Forence Sherrick, visited friends in Tacoma, according to the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, Apr. 22, 1900.

On Aug. 7, **1907** he dedicated to the public the streets and alleys in the property of the Ravenna Springs Park from 21st Ave NE to Ravenna Ave. NE and NE 65th Street and NE 63rd Street (lots 1 and 2). This is reported on May 27, 1907 in a legal document about University Place, an addition to the City of Seattle.

In **1909** Dr. J. D. Sherrick let a contract to Piett, Paddock & Hopper, of Everett, to build a large cement building, according to the Evening Statesman, July 27, 1909. This was in an area that had had a serious fire (in Edmonds) The title of the article is Fire was Benefit to Edmonds Folk. Destruction of Frame Structure Followed by Erection of Fine Blocks.

In **1910** the family consisted of Jacob (59), Julia (53), and Johnson (21). They lived in Edmonds Ward 1, Snohomish County, Washington. Perhaps Arthur Sherrick lived as a boarder in Seattle Ward 5. The 1910 census, though, gives his birthplace as Indiana and his parents' birthplaces as Illinois. He was a hardware salesman. The 1910 Seattle City Directory lists his son Johnson S. as a student U of W b. Lewis Hall.

In **1912** Dr. J. D. Sherrick was elected mayor of Edmonds, as reported by the Tacoma Times, Dec. 4, 1912. This was reported in an article giving election results and reporting that the socialist ticket had lost its grip on the city government.

Julia died on June 3, **1919** in Seattle, King County, Washington, aged 61 years, 10 months, and 19 days.

In **1920** Jacob Sherrick lived by himself at 3900 14th Ave NE, Seattle.

The Seattle City Directory **1921** lists Sherrick Jacob D phys r5808 15th Ave NE. Living at the same address is Sherrick Johnson (Hazel L) tchr h5808 15th Ave NE

The Seattle City Directdory **1922**, p. 1480, lists Sherrick Johnson tchr PS r302, living at 621 1st Ave W. There is no Jacob so he may have died by then.

The Seattle City Directory **1923** lists Sherrick Johnson (Hazel) tchr Lincoln High School, h4726 8th Ave NE.

Haven't found him in the 1930 or 1940 censuses. Haven't found a death certificate between 1920 and 1930 or later.

Arthur D. Sherrick

He was born on Apr. 13, **1885** in Missouri.

In the **1900** census, he is 15 and living with his parents in Puyallup, Ward 1,2, Pierce County, Washington..

In **1910** Arthur Sherrick lived as a boarder in Seattle Ward 5. The 1910 census, though, gives his birthplace as Indiana and his parents' birthplaces as Illinois. He was a hardware salesman.

In **1913** Arthur Jacob Sherrick was born to Arthur D. Sherrick and Blanch Smith. Their son Arthur Jacob Sherrick died in Spokane at the age of 38.

In **1920** he was 34, married, lived in Spokane with is wife Blanche S. Sherrick, age 44, born in Kansas, and his son, Arthur J. Sherrick, age 6, born in Washington.

In **1930** he was 44, married, lived in Spokane with is wife Blanche S. Sherrick, age 44, born in Kansas, and his sons, Arthur J. Sherrick, age 17, and Hugh O. Sherrick, age 9, both born in Washington.

In **1942** Arthur Danforth Sherrick registered for the draft in Spokane. He reported being born in Kansas City, Montana. He was 57, born Apr. 13, 1885.

On July 10, **1951**, Arthur Jacob Sherrick, the son of Arthur Sherrick, died in Spokane at the age of 38 (born about 1913).

On May 28, **1972** Arthur Sherrick, born Apr. 13, 1885, died in Spokane, Washington, age 87.

Florence Sherrick

She was born in October, **1881** in Kansas, according to the 1900 census.

In the **1900** census, she is 19 and living with her parents in Puyallup, Ward 1,2, Pierce County, Washington..

In the **1910** census, Florence Harris is 27, lives in Chelan, WA, age 27, married to Robert P. Harris, 35, born in New Jersey. She was born in Kansas and her parents were born in Ohio.

In **1920** Florence S. Harris, 37, born 1883, parents born in Ohio, married, but living in Ohio without her husband. Living there, too, is Robert P. Harris, age 7. There are two entries in Find a Grave for Robert P. Harris dying in World War I.

In the **1930** census, Florence S. Harris was widowed, age 47, born in Kansas, parents born in Ohio, born about 1883. She is living with Robert B. Harris, age 17, born in Washington. His father was born in New Jersey. They lived at 5226 Brooklyn Ave. (value \$4500) in Seattle and she was a librarian.

In the **1940** census, Florence S. Harris was widowed, lived in Tract C-2, Seattle, Seattle Election Precinct, King County, WA, had been born in Kansas about 1883. She lived (rented) at 6511 Roosevelt Way. Another one is divorced, age 57, born about 1883. The third one is Florence B. Harris, 58, born about 1882, widowed, living in Pearson Election Precinct, Snohomish, Washington.

On Mar. 24, **1954** Florence S. Harris, born about 1882, died in Seattle, age 72.

Johnson Sherrick

He was born Sept. 11, **1888** in Lincoln, Kansas.

In the **1900** census he was 12 living with his family.

In the **1910** census he was 21 and living in the Men's Dormitory in Seattle, but is listed there and at his parents' house in Edmonds. **The 1910** Seattle City Directory lists his son Johnson S. as a student U of W b. Lewis Hall.

In **1920** he is 31, married, living with his wife, Hazel L. Sherrick, age 27, born in Washington.

The Seattle City Directory **1921** lists Sherrick Jacob D phys r5808 15th Ave NE
Living at the same address is Sherrick Johnson (Hazel L) tchr h5808 15th Ave NE

The Seattle City Directdory **1922**, p. 1480, lists Sherrick Johnson tchr PS r302, living at 621 1st Ave W. There is no Jacob so he may have died by then.

The Seattle City Directory **1923** lists Sherrick Johnson (Hazel) tchr Lincoln High School, h4726 8th Ave NE.

In the **1930** census, he is 41, living with his wife, Hazel L. Sherrick, age 37, born in Washington, at 4726 8th Ave NE in Seattle.

n the **1940** census, he is 51, living with his wife, Hazel L. Sherrick, age 47, born in Washington. They live in block 86 in Seattle, address 2323 ... (can't read a street). He registered for the draft in WW I in Kittitas and Klickitat Counties (**1917-1918**) and for WW II in King County (**1942**).

He died on Dec. 5, **1973**, age 85, in King County and is buried in Lake Forest Park, King County, Washington.

City of Seattle annexes the Town of Ravenna on January 15, 1907.

On January 15, 1907, the City of Seattle annexes the Town of Ravenna, located just north of the University District.

On this day, the City Council of Seattle approved ordinance 15228 that added 0.62 square miles to Seattle. The former fourth class town was a five-block-wide strip that went between 15th Avenue NE and 20th Avenue NE and between NE 85th Street to NE 55th Street plus an area from 20th Avenue NE on the west and 30th Avenue NE on the east and from NE 65th Street on the north to NE 55th Street on the south.

During 1907, Seattle annexed seven adjacent areas that nearly doubled the size of the city from 35 square miles to 67 square miles. Later in the year, during August 1907, the Seattle City Council passed an ordinance (16791) renaming Ravenna's streets.
